 of Bogharbour in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey
 do think meet to make this my last will and testament
 while I am sound in mind and mental faculties —
 First I order all my just debts and funeral charges
 to be paid, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
 bairn all my real and personal Estate above noted of hands
 and all books debts and all my right in lands, I further
 order known my wife to pay a legacy to her son Champion
 my brother John Champion, my brother and Hannah Somers
 my sister, the sum of two dollars each to be paid when
 the notes is collected that I hold against Aaron Somers
 deceased. I do hereby constitute ordain and appoint my
 friend John Pennington of Mayl Garding Esq. and only
 Executor to this my last will and testament, revoking
 all former wills made by me ratifying this and no
 other to be my last will and testament. Whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of
 January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and forty two 1842. Signed sealed proven
 and published and delivered by Daniel Champion
 to be his last will and testament in the presence
 of his two witnesses as witnesseth
