

West forty links to the centre of an old ditch thence (3) North fifty four and a half degrees West binding Andrew Scull's line twenty five chains & thirty five links to the Northwest side of the public road leading down to Richard Dougherty's (9) South twenty six degrees West binding the Northwest side of the road fourteen chains and seventy four links to Enoch Champions corner and also Chatten Somers' corner thence (10) South forty seven and a half degrees East thirteen chains and sixty six links to the pine tree first named and place of beginning containing thirty six acres be the same more or less,

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Constant Smith Jr. the balance of my homestead plantation Beginning at the pine tree afore named standing in Chatten Somers' line and runs first South forty seven and a half degrees East binding said Somers' line seven chains and fifty one links to a stake for a corner (2) South forty eight degrees West four chains and ten links to a pine post for a corner then (3) South thirty three and a half degrees East still in said Somers' line forty eight chains & fourteen links to the lower end of the line ditch (4) North seventy seven and a half degrees East three chains and sixty five links binding a small creek (5) North forty five degrees East two chains still binding said creek to the landing creek thence (6) up said landing creek the several courses thereof and binding thereon up to a stake for a corner of Elvys Smith's land and nearly opposite to the lower end of the lane leading down from the house and barn to the meadow thence (7) South forty degrees West in Elvys' line three chains and seventy five links to a stake standing in the field on the Northwest side of the lane afore named (8) North fifty four and a half degrees West four chains and fifty links to a stake in side of the field (9) North eleven degrees East one chain and sixty six links to another stake for a corner (10) North fifty four degrees West binding the field fence four chains and sixty four links to a stake at the North corner of the field (11) North fifteen degrees West eight chains and sixty five links to another stake at the edge of the meadow for Elvys corner (12) South forty two and a half degrees West still in Elvys' line twelve chains and twenty six links to the pine tree first named and place of beginning containing about seventy five acres be the same more or less, It is my will and I do order my son Constant Smith Jr. to pay to my son John W. Smith the sum of fifty dollars from his own personal estate or from the proceeds of his real estate but not from my personal estate,

Item I give and bequeath unto my three sons John W. Smith, Constant Smith Jr. and Elvys Smith a certain tract of salt marsh which I purchased from Benjamin B. Cooper to be equally divided between the three share and share alike which tract of marsh is bounded as follows Beginning at a stake in the line ditch being a corner between Jeremiah Somers and the Joseph English

Plantation and runs first South sixty degrees West sixteen chains to landing creek (2) down the said creek the several courses thereof and binding thereon to Pat Conk Creek thence (3) up said Pat Conk Creek the several courses and distances thereof to Muddy Creek to a corner of John Somers' land or marsh thence (4) North twenty degrees West along said John Somers' line thirteen chains thence (5) North forty degrees East sixteen chains and fifty links to the line ditch of Joseph English and the aforesaid meadow thence (6) North fifty degrees West to the place of beginning containing eighty two acres and a half be the same more or less, Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons namely Constant Smith Jr. and Elvys Smith a tract of salt marsh known by the name of the Arons ground meadow to be equally divided between the two share and share alike which tract is bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a stake standing in the mouth of Arons Creek and runs (1) North fifty four degrees one chain thence (2) South fifty seven degrees West ten chains and seventy links thence (3) North forty degrees and a half West ten chains (4) South sixty five degrees and a half West four chains and twenty five links to a stake thence (5) South thirty six and a half degrees East thirteen chains and forty links (6) South seventeen degrees West twelve chains and sixty links to the division line between Lees (7) North sixty nine and a half degrees East seventeen chains to the river thence (8) North twenty one degrees West one chain and twelve links then (9) North three and one quarter degrees East sixteen chains and sixty links to the place of beginning containing twenty six and a half acres be the same more or less, it being the one half part of the Arons ground meadow,

Lastly I hereby appoint my son Constant Smith Jr. and David B. Somers Executors of this my last will and testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of August A.D. one thousand and eight hundred and fifty eight 1858
