Webber and Rachel Seaman share and share alike.

Lasty I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Jeremiah Risley and David B. Somers Executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 18th. day of June A.D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty 1860.
