

Will of Sallie M. Taylor

Be it remembered that I, Sallie M. Taylor being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding and considering the uncertainty of life in my present sickness, do therefore make certain publish and disclose this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say;

First, I order and direct that my Executor hereinafter named shall pay all my funeral expenses and just debts.

Second, I give devise and bequeath to David Ingram my Gold watch and chain and my small diamond ring.

Third, I give devise and bequeath to Lizzie P. Taylor Daughtery John H. Taylor my Piano, Diamond Cross, Bracelets, Sewing machine and all my wearing apparel.

Fourth, I give devise and bequeath to Joseph Morris Nichols my real estate in Atlantic City, State of New Jersey consisting of one Hotel, three Street houses and two Cottages known as the McCurdy Estate, together with all my personal property wherever found.

And lastly I do make constitute and appoint my Cousin John H. Taylor to be the Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and declaring these presents only to be and contain my last will and Testament.
