Item I order and direct that whatever interest income or sums of money may be due payable or coming from my Estate to my daughters or any of them shall in every case be paid to them in person or upon their written order; and the said Interest income or sums of money shall not be liable for the debts contracts or engagements or subject to the interference or control of any husband or husbands they or any of them may have or take

Item I order and direct my said executors to pay to each of my daughters upon her marriage the sum of three thousand dollars and to my son ~~when he shall arrive~~ at the age of twenty-one years the sum of five ~~thousand~~ dollars and the further sum of ten thousand dollars when he shall arrive at the age of twenty-five years; And the said sums so paid shall be charged ^{against} the share of the respective parties who shall receive the same

Lastly I appoint my brothers John & and Edwin Spooner and my friend Robert M. Logan the executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time made and I hereby authorize them and the survivors and survivor of them to take full charge of and manage my real estate to extinguish all or any of my ground rents to sell the whole or any portion of my said real estate either at public or private sale except such dwelling house ~~if any~~ and lot with the appurtenances as my said wife may elect to take under the devise hereinbefore made which shall not be sold during her life and to execute sufficient deeds to the purchasers of my said real estate without liability upon the part of the said purchasers to see to the application of the purchase money -- In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-sixth day of April A.D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty five

Codicil My wife being deceased I give and bequeath to my three daughters Annie V. Sarah J. and Frances L. Spooner all my household furniture Paintings Silver ware &c contained in my dwelling and I give and devise to my daughter above named and my son David C. Spooner Jr for their joint home so long as they or either of them remain unmarried the dwelling house in which I may be living up to the time of my decease together with the lot of ground on which the same may be erected and the appurtenances thereto belonging but if they should prefer it I direct my executors or Trustees to purchase or rent for them any property they may designate provided the value of the property so chosen does not exceed that herein devised to them I appoint as my executors in place of those named in the foregoing will my friend George W. Horn and Benton H. Jamison whom I also appoint Guardians for my son David C. Spooner Jr In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of November A.D.
