

Will of Obid H. Crosby.

I, Obid H. Crosby of Atlantic City State of New Jersey, do make this my last will and testament, in manner following to wit.

First I direct all my just debts and my funeral expenses to be paid after my decease.

Second I give and devise my real estate where I now reside viz. 16716 Atlantic Avenue Atlantic City to my brother George W. Crosby, provided he shall within one year after my decease pay for the same the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.) to be used by my executor hereinafter named for the purpose of paying the legatee under my will the title of said real estate to in no wise pass until the said sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.) shall be paid.

Third I give and devise of my personal estate to my brother George W. Crosby, my executor hereinafter named to hold in trust the sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.) for the use and benefit of my adopted daughter Marie Crosby (formerly Marie Jeffries) as hereinafter provided for. Also the sum of two thousand dollars in addition to said sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.) in case the policy for two thousand dollars (\$2,000.) I now hold in the "Ancient Order of United Workmen" should in any way or manner not be paid by said lodge or order.

Fourth I appoint my executor hereinafter named guardian of my said adopted daughter Marie Crosby during her minority the said sum of eight thousand dollars above mentioned to be invested by him in a safe manner, and the income and so much as may be needful of the principal to be used by my said executor as guardian in the support maintenance and education of my said adopted daughter during her minority, the residue of said fund to be given to her absolutely at the time she shall attain her majority. In case my said adopted daughter Marie Crosby shall not live to attain or reach her majority then the said sum of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.) shall be equally divided between my brother George W. Crosby and my two sisters Millie E. Crosby and Hannah E. Crosby share and share alike.

Fifth I give and bequeath to my said adopted daughter Marie Crosby my piano, bedroom furniture in the room now used by me, oil paintings and silver ware.

Sixth I give and bequeath to my said sisters Millie E. and Hannah E. Crosby each the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.)

Seventh I give and bequeath to my father Elias Crosby the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.)

Eighth I give and bequeath to the First Baptist Church of Atlantic City N.J. the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.)

Ninth I give and bequeath to my brother George W. Crosby my library and my surgical instruments also all the residue of my personal property of what nature or kind soever.

Tenth I constitute and appoint my said brother George W. Crosby sole executor of this my last will and testament.

First I give and devise of my personal estate to M. Lovell Munson of the town of Franklin county of Delaware and State of New York the following described property viz: my bay mare maid (so called) one old horse harness and one phaeton carriage, being the same and only horse harness and carriage I now have or own in the said town of Franklin, Also my hunter case gold watch and gold chain.

Second I give and devise of my said personal estate to the said M. Lovell Munson to hold in trust the sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.) for the use and benefit of my adopted daughter Marie Crosby (formerly Marie Jeffries) Also the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.) in addition to said sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.) in case the policy of two thousand (\$2,000.) I now hold in the "Ancient Order of United Workmen" should in any way or manner not be paid by said lodge or order.

Third I appoint M. Lovell Munson (aforesaid) guardian of my said adopted daughter Marie Crosby during her minority.
