In the name of God Amen I Sarah J. Adams of the Village of Port Republic County of Atlantic, and State of New Jersey, Being of sound mind memory and understanding do publish and make this my last will and testament, in manner following - that is to say -

Third I give and bequeath all the remaining portion of my estate, both real and personal to my beloved husband Henry Adams during his life time, After his decease to be divided as follows

First I give and devise unto my two sisters Annie B. and Alice A. Blake the Homestead at Port Republic adjoining Eliza J. Adams Josephine (deceased) Wilson and others, containing six acres more or less,

Second I give and bequeath unto Annie B. Blake 100 feet at Atlantic City adjoining her own lot and others;

Fourth I give and bequeath unto Hannah my neice One hundred dollars (\$100.00)
