Eighth To Samuel Richardson of Ottawa I give and bequeath the painting of the nativity of our Saviour for himself and family and hope he will act as my executor.

Ninth To Maria Jones I give and bequeath the painting of the Madonna in my room here.

Tenth To my brother Joseph H. Riley I devise and bequeath for and during his natural life, the use of one fifth of the property of my estate, and after his death the above mentioned share shall be divided equally among my sisters and I do hereby direct that the share hereby divided and bequeathed to my said brother shall be held by the executors of my will and only the rents issues and profits thereof shall be paid over to my said brother Joseph H. Riley.

I do hereby appoint my sister Abby M. Baker and Samuel Richardson executors of this my last Will and testament hereby revoking any and all Wills by me made and declaring this to be my only last Will and testament. And I do hereby request that Mrs. Baker shall not be required to give any bond as executor of this will for any money or property that may come into her hands by virtue of the trust hereby created.

Letters Testamentary - Probate Court of Cook County.

The People of the State of Illinois To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting;

Know Ye, That whereas Berulah C. Dickey late of the County of Cook and State of Illinois died on or about the 12th day of September A.D. 1887, as it is said after having duly made and published her last Will and testament, a copy whereof is hereunto annexed, leaving at the time of her death property in this State which may be lost, destroyed or diminished in value if speedily care be not taken of the same; and inasmuch as it appears that Samuel Richardson has been appointed executor in and by the said last will and testament, to execute the same and to the end that the said property may be preserved for those who shall appear to have a legal right or interest therein and that said will may be executed according to the request of the said testatrix we do hereby authorize him the said Samuel Richardson as such executor to collect and secure all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits which were of the said Berulah C. Dickey at the time of her decease in whosoever hands or possessions the same may be found in this State and well and truly to perform and fulfill all such duties as may be enjoined upon him by the said will, so far as there shall be property and the law charge him and in general to do and perform all other acts which now or hereafter may be required of him by law.
