Know all Men by these Presents that we, Albert F.

are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary of the  
State of New Jersey, in the sum of Twenty-four Thous-  
and dollars to be paid to the said ordinary or his assigns;  
to which payment well and truly to be made we bind  
ourselves, our and each of our heirs, successors, executors,  
and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these  
presents.

Sealed with our seals, and dated this twentieth day  
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and ninety-two.

The condition of this Obligation is such, That  
whereas the Surrogate of the county of Atlantic  
State of New Jersey, has appointed Albert F. Bronson Ad-

ministrator with the will annexed, of the estate of Eli Stock-  
well deceased. Now, therefore, if the above bounden Al-  
bert F. Bronson Administrator as aforesaid, do make  
or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all  
and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the  
said deceased, which have or shall come to the  
hands, possession or knowledge of the said Albert  
F. Bronson or into the hands or possession of any  
other person or persons for the said Albert F. Bronson  
and the same so made, do exhibit into the Surro-  
gate's Office of the county of Atlantic, State of New  
Jersey, at or before the expiration of three calendar  
months from the date of the above written obligation  
and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all  
other goods, chattels and credits, of the said deceased,  
at the time of his death, which at any time after  
shall come into the hands or possession of any other  
person or persons for the said Albert F. Bronson do well  
and truly Administer according to law; and further  
do make or cause to be made a just and true account  
of his Administration, within one year from the  
above date of the above written obligation; and all  
the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and  
credits which shall be found remaining upon the  
account of the said administration, the same being  
first examined and allowed by the Judges of the Orphans  
Court of the county, or other competent authority, shall  
deliver and pay unto such person or persons respect-  
ively as is, are or shall by law be entitled to  
receive the same; then the above obligation to be

force and virtue.
