

Be it Remembered, That on the Twenty-fifth day of June eighteen hundred and ninety-four, Charles W. Winders the Executor named in a paper writing, bearing date January 18th A.D. 1894, and purporting to be the last will and Testament of Lydia J. Collison, deceased, late of the County of Mercer, and State of New Jersey, and Codicil thereto, bearing date June 4th A.D. 1894 - appeared before the Orphan's Court of the County of Mercer, and made application to have the said Will and Codicil proved, a caveat against admitting the same to probate having been filed in the Surrogate's office of said county; and on such application said Court having heard testimony in the said matter adjudged the said Will and Codicil to be valid, and the proofs thereof, to be sufficient, which said last Will and Testament and Codicil, and the proofs thereof, are as follows; that is to say:

In the name of God, Amen, I, Lydia J. Collison, of the City of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, make and publish my last will and testament in manner following, to wit:

First. I direct all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid as soon as may be reasonable after my decease.

Second. I give bequeath and devise the sum of Five Dollars to Amanda Martin wife of Peter Martin of the City of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey.


Third. - I give bequeath and devise the sum of Fifteen Dollars to my daughter Anna Truinda Cray, wife of Robert Cray, of the City and County of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania.

Fourth. - I give, bequeath and devise to my son Charles W. Winders of Mounmouth Junction, in the County Middlesex and State of New Jersey, all my remaining estate, both real and personal, in whatever it may consist or wherever situate, to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

Fifth. - I constitute and appoint my said son Charles W. Winders, sole executor of this my last will and testament.
