3. I give and devise unto my two grand-children,

and west by meadow on the south by John
Doughty's land, to be theirs and their heirs and
assigns, to be equally divided between the said
Delia Couver and Rodnie Doughty, the most
westwardly half to be Delia Couver's.

4. I also give and devise unto the said Delia
Couver all the meadow lying between the
main land and Doughty's Creek and west
of that point in said Creek known as the
"Grallings"

5. I give and bequeath to my son John Doughty
Five Dollars.

6. I constitute and appoint Albert E. Couver ex-
ecutor of this my last will and testament.
