Fifth: I give and bequeath to my wife's cousin, Adele S. Montgomery, (who has been a member of my household for many years), her executors, administrators and assigns, the sum of Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), lawful money of the United States of America.

Sixth: I give and bequeath to Lydia Arey, daughter of Margaret Arey and the late Joseph S. Arey, her executors, administrators and assigns, the sum of Three thousand dollars (\$3,000) lawful money of the United States of America.

Seventh: I give and bequeath to William E. Arey, brother of the above named Lydia Arey, his executors, administrators and assigns, the sum of Three thousand dollars (\$3,000), lawful money of the United States of America.

Eighth: I give and bequeath to the said Margaret Arey, widow of said Joseph S. Arey, her executors, administrators and assigns, the sum of Three thousand dollars (\$3,000), lawful money of the United States of America.

Ninth: I give and bequeath to Elizabeth S. Barrett, daughter of the late Ezra T. Barrett, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) lawful money of the United States of America.

Tenth: I give and bequeath to Mary A. Taylor, widow of Stephen Taylor, deceased, and sister of the above named Elizabeth S. Barrett if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500), lawful money of the United States of America.

Eleventh: I give and bequeath to my cousin, William H. Eisenbrey, son of the late Philip Eisenbrey, the sum of Three thousand dollars (\$3,000), lawful money of the United States of America, if he should be living at the time of my decease. If he should not be living at the time of my decease, I do give and bequeath the said sum of Three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to Batharine E. Hall, Sarah A. Eisenbrey and Anna Eisenbrey, the three sisters of said William H. Eisenbrey, or the survivor or survivors of them, to be equally divided between them.

Twelfth: I give and bequeath to my nephew, Edwin T. Eisenbrey, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000), lawful money as aforesaid.

Thirteenth: I give and bequeath to my nephew, William Harrison Eisenbrey, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000), lawful money as aforesaid.

Fourteenth: I give and bequeath to my niece Mary Morris, daughter of my brother John, the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000), lawful money as aforesaid, if she be liv-

ing at the time of my decease.

Fifteenth: I give and bequeath to Mrs. Emma Godwin, widow of the late Samuel B. Godwin, her executors, administrators and assigns, the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) lawful money as aforesaid, and I do further order and direct my executors, hereinafter named, to cancel the promissory note in the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000) belonging to me, signed by the said Mrs. Emma Godwin and her late husband, Samuel B. Godwin.

Sixteenth: I give and bequeath to my nephew, Joseph E. Galley, son of my sister, Caroline Speed, the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) lawful money as aforesaid, to be paid to him by my said executors in equal monthly sums of Twenty-five dollars (\$25) until the whole of the said sum is exhausted. In the event of the death of the said Joseph E. Galley before my decease, the said sum of Two thousand dollars is to be paid to the surviving widow and children if any, of the said Joseph E. Galley, in such amounts and at such times as may be deemed best in the exercise of a just discretion by my executors.

Seventeenth: I give and bequeath to William E. Dutton, the grandson of my sister Caroline Speed, the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2,000), lawful money as aforesaid, to be paid to him by my said executors, in equal monthly sums of Twenty-five dollars (\$25) until the whole of said sum is exhausted. In the event of the death of the said William E. Dutton before my decease, the said sum of Two thousand dollars is to be paid to the surviving widow and children, if any, of the said William E. Dutton, in such amounts and at such times as may be deemed best in the exercise of a just discretion by my executors.

X Eighteenth: I give and bequeath to William Grosscup, my successor in business, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500) lawful money as aforesaid.

Nineteenth: I give and bequeath to Frederick H. Grosscup, son of said William Grosscup, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) lawful money as aforesaid.

Twentieth: I give and bequeath to Charles William Grosscup, son of said William Grosscup, if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) lawful money as aforesaid.

Twenty-first: I give and bequeath to Reverend Joseph A. Seiss, D. D., L. L. D., if living at the time of my decease, the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500) lawful money as aforesaid.
