Beginning at a stake in the center of the cross Road, near where James Lee now lives and run (1) North thirty three degrees East, one chain and fifty links to a corner of the James Lee lot. then North forty eight degrees West <sup>thirty</sup> nine chains and fifty links to a corner of said tract. then South one degree and forty minutes West thirteen chains to a corner. then South forty-eight degrees and thirty minutes East nine chains and seventy-five links to a corner. then South thirty degrees East five chains to a corner. then South seventy-seven degrees and thirty minutes East sixteen chains. then South <sup>thirty</sup> ~~thirty~~ <sup>thirty</sup> degrees and a <sup>thirty</sup> ~~thirty~~ <sup>thirty</sup> minutes East thirteen chains and twenty links to the middle of the road leading from Smith's Mill to Estab. Estab. and said land by the said James Estab. and said commissioners. then North twenty-nine degrees East twenty chains to a corner. then South fifty-four degrees and thirty minutes East thirty-two chains to a corner. then South ten degrees East seven chains and seventy-five links to a corner. then South sixty-seven degrees and thirty minutes West thirty-seven chains crossing the branch and a small branch to a white oak stump. then South sixty degrees and fifteen minutes West fourteen chains to a pine knot corner. then South seventy-one degrees West fifteen chains and fifty links to a pine knot. South Eighty-four degrees West to a stake ten chains. then North forty-five degrees and thirty minutes West twelve chains and eighty links to a pine lettered C.R.L.S.D.S. then North sixty degrees West sixteen chains and seventy links to a stake. then South fifteen degrees and thirty minutes East eight chains and eighty links to a stake for a corner. then South twenty-two degrees and thirty minutes East four chains and ten links to a corner. then South forty-five degrees East fourteen chains and fifty links to a small iron pine. now down and a stake in the place. then South thirty-three degrees and thirty minutes East sixteen chains and seventy-five links to a pine knot and white oak stump. then

And we do Assign and set off to Elizabeth Estab. No. 9 on the Map herunto annexed, situate in the Township of Hamilton in the County of Atlantic. Beginning at the center of the cross Road where the Smith Mill road crosses the Turkeyhoe Road near where James Lee lives and run (1) along the road leading to Turkeyhoe South thirty degrees East twenty-five chains to a corner in said road. then South thirty degrees West eighty chains and thirty seven links to a corner. then South fifteen chains and thirty links to a stake in the swamp in the outside line of said tract and in the line of Kinsey and Cooper's land. and run thence by the same North Eighty degrees West fifty eight chains to edge of the bridge of St. Pauls. Branch to a small black oak marked for a corner. then North twenty degrees East five chains and fifty links to a stake by Beaver Dam Road. then North eighty degrees East two chains and twenty eight links to a corner. then North seven degrees East eighteen chains to a stake. corner by the field. then North forty-one degrees and thirty minutes East four chains and thirty six links to a dead pine. then North fifteen degrees and thirty minutes West four chains and thirty four links. then North twenty-two degrees and thirty minutes East two chains and twenty five links to a stake by a small Spring. then North twenty degrees West ten chains and fifty links to a stake. then North seventy-one degrees West two chains and sixty-five links to a dead pine. then North fifty-three degrees and thirty minutes West three chains to a stake. then North twenty-three degrees and thirty minutes West one chain and thirty six links to a stake in the middle of the road leading to Smith's Mill. then North seventy-two degrees and thirty minutes East twenty-five chains and fifty links to an angle in the road. then North seventy-three degrees and thirty minutes East forty-nine chains. then North thirty-three degrees East seven chains and eighty links to a corner. then South thirteen degrees and thirty minutes East twenty-one chains and sixty links to a corner. then South seventy-nine degrees East seventeen chains and sixty links to a corner. then North thirteen degrees and thirty minutes West forty-three chains and thirty links to a stone in the middle of said road. then North thirty-three degrees East twenty-one chains and fifty links to the place of beginning. Containing 724 <sup>1/2</sup> acres. be the same more or less. after excepting 3 acres belonging to sundry other individuals.

And we do Assign and set off to Ann Edgare, wife of Abraham L. Edgare late Ann Estab. Lot marked on the map herunto annexed. No. 10. being what is called the steelman's Barn. Beginning at a corner in the middle of the landing lane, opposite a small white oak, and in range of the post and rail fence; and run along said post and rail fence North thirty-one degrees and forty minutes East twenty-one chains and eighty-four links passing in the middle of a cut to the bank at the foot of a small brook which formerly fell into the main Stephens brook. nearly opposite where James Edgare now lives. then bounding by said brook the following bounds. South twenty-one degrees and fifteen minutes East two chains. then South thirty-one degrees and forty-five minutes East two chains and sixty links. then South forty-eight degrees East two chains and eighty-three links. then South sixty degrees East one chain and fifty eight links. then South thirty-five degrees and thirty minutes East five chains and seventy-three links. then South thirty degrees and thirty minutes East two chains and sixty links.
