

of taking an oath) was duly affirmed before John Hogan Esq. one of the judges of the superior court of common pleas in a Orphan's Court of Davis County of Atlanta, this <sup>21<sup>st</sup> day of December, 1829, I, James E. Estell, declare and affirm that they will make a fair and just partition of the Writhe's named real estate between Davis & Estell, under the hand of John Estell and as he is named, without partiality, favor or affection, according to the best of their understanding.</sup>

And proceed to divide the land in said Appointment mentioned, whereof the said John Estell died seized in his principles, not especially described in his last will and testament, situated in the County of Atlanta, according to the intent and of law order. And we have ascertained the metes and bounds of the several tracts of land set off to Davies & Estell and the heirs at law of John Estell as follows: That is to say - first the metes and bounds of the share and proportion of Davies are as follows -

Tract No. 1. Beginning at a forked pine corner to Peter Stelleman's land between O on the west and S on the south east side thereof and runs (1) North thirty-one degrees East twelve chains to a corner of one hundred thirty acres bought of Joseph E. West, being the north east corner thereof and runs from thence along the line thereof including the same (2) North thirty-six degrees and thirty minutes West thirty-five chains and thirty links to a corner, thence (3) North fourties degrees and thirty minutes West two chains and fifty links to a corner, thence (4) North eighty degrees and thirty minutes West fifty chains and ninety links to a stake corner, thence (5) North seventy-nine degrees and thirty minutes West thirteen chains and eighty links to a forked black oak corner.

C. thence (6.) South eighty-four degrees and five minutes West seventeen chains and thirty links to a high pine stump corner, thence (7) South eight degrees and thirty minutes East seventeen chains and twenty links to a stake by the edge of the branch of Stelleman's Creek, thence (8.) crossing a branch of Stelleman's creek and an island south forty-eight degrees and thirty minutes East fourteen chains and fifty links to a small cedar marked for a corner in the edge of the cedar swamp, thence up the same (9.) South eleven degrees and thirty minutes East seven chains and eighty links to three stakes and a small black oak marker for a corner by the side thereof, thence (10.) North sixty-seven degrees and thirty minutes West nine chains and eighty links to a stake near the edge of the swamp, thence (11.) South fifty-nine degrees thirty minutes West forty-four chains and ninety links to a down pine oak marked by the westerty tree of a small branch, a pine knot in the stem to thence (12.) South seventy-nine degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen chains and thirty-five links to a stake corner being the north westerty corner of One Acre purchased of Uriah Coop, thence continuing along the westerty line thereof (13.) South forty-one degrees and thirty minutes West fifty-eight chains and eighty links to a pine oak marked for a corner, thence (14.) North sixty-four degrees and fourty minutes West two chains and forty-five links to a white oak corner, thence (15.) South twenty-nine degrees West nine chains and eighty links to a stake south west of the road leading from John Stelleman's to Peasey Morton, thence (16.) South one degree West six chains and twenty-five links to a chestnut oak marked for a corner, thence (17.) South eighty degrees and thirty minutes East twenty-four chains and fifty links crossing said Stelleman's road again to a corner, thence (18.) South five degrees East crossing said road again twenty chains and ninety links to a red oak stump corner now a stake of the same marked, thence (19.) South eighty-eight degrees West six chains and ninety-eight links

to a corner in the old road, N 88° 53' links from a stone corner, thence (20.) South forty-four degrees and thirty minutes East sixteen chains of forty-three links to a corner in said old road, still by the same & the south westerty line thereof (21.) South fifty-three degrees East seven chains to a corner, then still on the southwardly side of said road (22.) East four chains to a stake in the old pine, thence (23.) South fifty-two and one-half links three chains and seventy-five links to a stake in the fence, thence (24.) North seventy-two degrees East three chains and seventy-five links to a stake in the fence, thence (25.) North forty-two degrees East five chains to a post, thence (26.) South thirty-nine degrees East seven chains to a corner in the road from Estell's Glass factory to Smith's Mill, thence along the same (27.) North forty-three degrees and thirty minutes East fifty-seven chains and ten links to an angle in said road, then still along the middle of said road (28.) North sixty degrees and fifteen minutes East eighty-three chains and fifty links to the forks of the road, thence (29.) North seventy-four degrees and thirty minutes East thirteen chains and sixty links to a corner in said road, then (30.) South forty-seven degrees and thirty minutes West nine chains and fifty links to a corner, thence (31.) South sixty-nine degrees East four chains to a stump for a corner, thence (32.) South forty-eight degrees East ~~one-half~~ twenty chains to a corner (33.) North fifty-one degrees East seventeen chains and fifty links crossing a small branch to a corner, thence (34.) North forty-nine degrees and thirty minutes West twenty chains to a corner, thence (35.) North sixty-seven degrees West five chains and fifty links to a stake in the ditch, thence (36.) South forty-seven degrees West five chains and fifty links to another stake in said ditch, thence (37.) South eighty-two degrees West two chains and sixty-two links to a stake corner, thence (38.) North twenty-one degrees West thirty-five links to a stake corner, thence (39.) North sixteen degrees East six chains to a corner, thence (40.) South eighty-three degrees East eight chains and twelve links to a stake for a corner (41.) North twenty-nine degrees East four chains and fifty links to the place of beginning, containing 1780 acres, be the same more or less; together with the woods, buildings and improvements, and all things thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining.

Also the lot No. 2, in the map hereto annexed, situated in the Township of Newington in said County Beginning at a pine tree on the north side of Gibbons' Creek, being corner to a tract of land conveyed by Mary M. Wallace to the said John Estell, then along the line of said tract North twenty-three degrees East thirty-three chains to a corner, thence (2.) South twelve degrees and thirty minutes West thirty-six chains to the corner of said tract, thence (3.) North fifty-two degrees West six chains and seventy-five links to the place of beginning containing ten acres and 80 hundredths of an acre strict measure be the same more or less.

Also Tract No. 3 in the map hereto annexed, situated in the Township of Newington aforesaid Beginning in the public road leading from Buckhorns to May's Landing about 61.50 ch. to the northward of the cross road and in the line of the Georgia Survey in a hollow on said road, then along a line of a survey made to George West (1) South seventy-one degrees West thirteen chains and seventy-five links (2) North fifty-nine degrees West three chains and ninety links (3) North two degrees East nine chains and fifty links (4) North East fifteen chains and seventy-five links to the said road, then in the same (5) South sixteen degrees East nineteen chains to the place of beginning, containing twenty-two acres and a hundred and twenty-five hundredths of an acre be the same more or less.
