

and seventy links binding the line of No. 10, to the race thence (2) South westerly binding the race the several courses thereof about seven chains and thirty links the North corner of lot No. 8, thence (3) binding the line of lot No. 8, about six chains and thirty links to Daniel Smith's Southwest corner thence (4) Binding said Smith's line North forty five degrees East seven chains and ten links to the place of beginning containing four acres and fifteen hundredths of an acre to be the same more or less, that being his share in the Homestead property We also set off the Mill with about two and a half acres of land on the Southeast of the same to Umpfrey Scull Beginning at a stake by the side of a bar post and edge of the road leading from said Scull's house to the Mill and runs first North, twenty five and a half degrees East five chains to a stake in the field thence (2) North, seventy two degrees West four chains and twenty five links to the edge of the pond thence (3) Northeasterly direction binding by the edge of the pond to the head thereof thence crossing the race or head of the pond to the Northwest side thereof thence - binding by the edge thereof down to a pine tree marked for a corner standing near the Northwest end of the Mill dam thence (4) South, sixty five and a half degrees East, two chains to another corner thence (5) South, thirty degrees East two chains and thirty one links to a stone by the edge of sd. Mill dam for a corner thence (6) South, thirty two and a half degrees West crossing the road to a cedar for a corner distance one chain and fourteen links thence (7) South, fifty degrees East three and a half chains to a stone in middle of the road just below the top of the hill thence (8) South, seventy two degrees East binding said road three chains and twenty five links to the stake and post first named and place of beginning containing two and a half acres as above stated together with all the Mill privileges as has been heretofore used all the above and last described tract is set off to Umpfrey Scull as his share purchased of James L. Somers with his paying the sum of six hundred and twenty five dollars to the other three heirs The Commissioners adjudging that to be worth that sum over and above the equal shares of the Homestead plantation of said James L. Somers dec'd with the Mill etc, that includes all the Homestead property as appears to the map attached hereto will more fully and at large appear,
