

North fifty three and three quarters West thirteen chains and thirty five links still in Doughtys line to the place of beginning containing within said bounds two hundred nine acres and a half, out of the same is excepted twenty six and a half acres being one half of a Mason survey which belongs to Israel S. Adams leaving a balance of one hundred and eighty three acres be the same more or less.
We also set off to the heirs aforesaid Lot No. 2. A. It Being a part of what is called the six hundred acre tract Beginning at a post standing on the South west side of what is called the Tilton Road and at the crossing of what is called the Ford road and runs first North twenty one degrees West up said Tilton road and binding by the same fifty four chains and fifty links to the Mays Landing Road thence (2) North sixty seven degrees & a half West 36.28 chains binding said road to a stake at the North corner of lot No. 1. C. thence (3) South Nineteen degrees East fifty four chains and eighty six links to a stake for a corner (4) South seven nine degrees and one quarter East Thirty chains and sixty eight links to another stake for a corner thence (5) South thirty three degrees and one quarter West fourteen chains and sixty seven links to the Ford road thence (6) North seventy one degrees and a half East binding said Ford road nineteen chains and seventy links to the Tilton road and place of beginning containing one hundred and eighty two acres be the same more or less, the afore described two tracts of land was put off as being one third part in value of the lands divided as afores ordered,

Lot No. 1. B. We set off to Joseph Baker It being the West end of what is called the six hundred acre tract Beginning at a pine tree standing on the South west side of the Clam road and near the edge thereof and is a corner to Enoch Doughtys Bay on R. Richards lands and runs first in said line an East course eight chains and fifty links to a post thence (2) North thirteen degrees West sixty seven chains and fifty links to the Mays Landing road thence (3) North sixty seven degrees and a half West binding said road to a post for a corner (4) South seventy two degrees West thirty chains to a post (5) South eleven degrees East thirty chains and seventy five links to another post the (6) South fifty two degrees East fifty chains and seventy links to the pine tree first named and place of beginning containing two hundred and nineteen acres be the same more or less.

The second Lot No. 2. B. Beginning at a stake standing on the South west side of the Clam road and at the edge thereof which stake stands up said road above the other beginning corner and runs first South eighty four degrees West eight chains and twenty links to a post (2) North eighty seven degrees and a half West twenty chains and thirty links to a post (3) South thirty four degrees and three quarters West forty seven chains and sixty links to a white oak tree for a corner (4) North forty two degrees and one quarter West twenty chains to a post (5) North thirty eight and three quarter degrees East twenty eight chains and sixteen links to a post (6) North seventy seven degrees East fifteen chains and eighty eight links to a post standing on the West side of the new road (7) North seventeen degrees and a half West seventeen chains and thirty five links to a post (8) North sixty eight degrees West ten chains to a post (9) South eighty seven degrees & a half East twelve chains and forty seven links to a small black oak for a corner standing on the South side of the new road and then bearing

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forty eight degrees East twenty nine chains to the place of beginning containing one hundred and nineteen acres be the same more or less.
Lot No. 3. B. Beginning at a post standing on the North west side of the road leading from Murphy Scrub to Swamp Side and runs first North twenty two degrees and one quarter West fourteen chains and ten links to a post for a corner (2) South seventy two degrees and three quarters West thirty chains to a post (3) South twenty seven degrees one quarter east thirty four chains and eighty links to a post by the side of the road first named (4) North thirty three degrees East along said road thirty two chains and sixty five links to the post first named and place of beginning containing seventy one acres be the same more or less.
The 4th. Lot Being No. 4. B. is Cedar swamp Beginning at a post in the line of lot No. 1. A. five chains and fifty links from the corner in the Buck field and from Daniel Bakers line and runs first North sixty three degrees West fourteen chains and forty links to another post for a corner (2) South thirty degrees West four chains to the run the (3) down the run the several courses thereof a Southeasterly direction about fifteen chains to a post by the side of said run and corner to lot No. 1. E. Then (4) binding the line of said lot North thirty degrees East nine chains and twenty five links to the place of beginning containing about seven and one quarter acres be the same more or less, out of said tract there is excepted a part of a survey belonging to Richard J. Somers the four tracts as afores described are set off to Joseph Baker as his equal one third part of said lands.

Lot No. 1. C. Is also a part of the six hundred acre tract Beginning at the East corner of lot. No. 1. D. and runs first North thirteen degrees West sixty seven degrees and fifty links to the Mays Landing road thence (2) South sixty seven degrees and a half East twenty chains and seventy links to a post at the Northwest corner of lot No. 2. A. Then (3) South thirteen degrees East fifty four chains and eighty six links to a post thence (4) North seventy nine degrees and one quarter West fourteen chains and sixty links to a post (5) a due West course three chains to the place of beginning containing ninety seven acres be the same more or less.

Lot No. 2. C. Beginning at a post standing by the side of the main run It being the North West corner of Alexander Fishes cedar swamp and runs (1) North thirty six degrees East in said Fish line in part passing his Northeast corner nineteen chains to Enoch Doughtys line then (2) West course twelve chains and seventy links to a post (3) North thirteen degrees East twenty five chains and sixty links to a post (4) North forty five degrees West seven chains to a post for a corner thence (5) South forty five degrees West about thirty chains to a post at the edge of the run of the branch called Isaacs Branch then down the said run to the main run thence down the main run the several courses thereof about thirty chains to the post first named and place of beginning containing Seventy seven acres be the same more or less. The above two described lots was set off to Jesse Somers and one half of the following described lot and marked

Lot No. 1. E. Beginning at a post for a corner standing what is called the Buck field and in Daniel Bakers line and runs first North sixty three degrees West five chains and fifty links to another post for a corner standing in the edge of said field (2) South thirty degrees West nine chains and forty five links to the run thence (3) down said run a Southeasterly direction five chains to Daniel Bakers line thence (4) North thirty degrees East about the place of beginning containing about
