4th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Harriet Frankes half dozen Teaspoons marked H. S. also the mahogany table in the sitting room.

5th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Hannah E. Steelman, one feather bed, two (2) pillows and one bolster, also the silver spoons half dozen large, and half dozen small, marked H. E. F.

6th: I give, and bequeath to my nephew Job Frankes the walnut bed room suit of furniture in the room down stairs, consisting of Bedstead, Bureau, wash stand, Rocker, and two cane seat chairs.

7th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Ina R. Smith the bedstead and wash stand in the spare room up stairs.

8th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Mary Louisa Frankes the china tea set.

9th: I give, and bequeath to my step grand daughter Emma F. Smith, the set of dishes in dining room said dishes are matched sets of dinner and tea.

10th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Pollie Nelson my gold watch and chain.

11th: I give, and bequeath to my nephew Alfred Frankes the round table in the sitting room.

12th: I give, and bequeath to my niece Pollie I. Trucks fathers picture that hangs in the parlor, the old clock that is in the sitting room. Also two hundred dollars (200) in money for her kind attention and care of me during my sickness.

The balance of the estate, both personal, and real to be left in the hands of the executors, to be disposed of by sale, or otherwise, as they think best to carry out my wishes.

13th: I will that one hundred dollars (\$100.00) be invested by the executors hereinafter named, in such a manner that the interest thereof accruing from year to year shall be used to keep up the burial lot of John I. Borson in the cemetery of the M. E. Church in Tuckahoe, County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey.

I will that the burial lot of my grand father Ireland, located in the Zion cemetery of Bargaintown, County of Atlantic, and state of New Jersey, be put in suitable condition for the erection of a monument, and that a monument, costing two hundred dollars or about that amount, be placed on the lot, the record now on the three slabs being transferred to the monument, and that the balance of money left from my estate after all behests and expenses are paid, be invested by the executors, and the interest thereof accruing from year to year shall be used to keep up my grand father Irelands burial lot, my fathers burial lot, and other members of the family whos burial lots are located in Zion cemetery at Bargaintown County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey. Should there be any interest money left after said lots are fixed up each year, it is to be given for the benefit of

Zion church in Bargaintown as above located.

I appoint as my executors to carry out this my last will and testament F. F. Borson, and J. S. Frankes
