with the provisions of the Act relating to Collateral Inheritance.

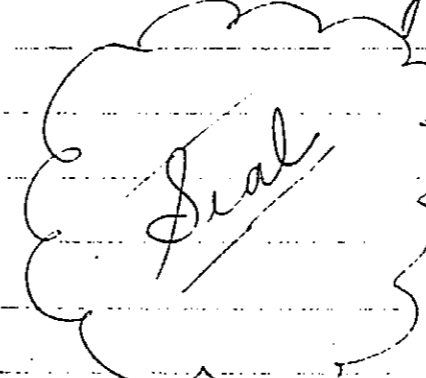
