Third: All the rest and remainder of my Estate, real, personal and mixed, wheresoever and whatsoever the same may be at the time of my death I give, bequeath and devise unto my said wife Wilhelmina Feil for and during all the term of her natural life, provided however she so long remains my widow. And from and immediately after the death of my said wife, or in case of her remarriage, then from and immediately after such remarriage, I give bequeath and devise the same unto the Brothers and Sisters of my said wife, and the issue of such of them as maybe dead, in equal proportions or shared, such issue however to take by representation only such share as their deceased parent would have taken if living. To have and to hold the same for themselves their Heirs and Assigns forever. Lastly: I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Martin H. Stutzback, Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
