 10. Notwithstanding the previous provisions of my Will my surviving executor or his successor or successors shall have the power and authority at any time after the decease of my wife that he or they in his or their discretion shall deem it best so to do, to cease paying over to my two sons Joseph B. Rockhill and William H. Rockhill respectively the one-fourth part of the net income of my estate hereinbefore bequeathed and devised to them, and shall apply the same to the support and maintenance of the families of my said sons and to the education of their children during the life-time of my said sons respectively and upon their death to divide the same among their children in the manner hereinbefore set forth.

11. I wish my executors under this will to be held responsible only for fraud and not for any errors of judgment they may make.

12. Any one of my executors may perform all the acts and exercise all the discretion hereby conferred upon both, and any successor appointed by the proper court shall also have the same rights power and authority as is conferred upon those appointed by this will.
