I also authorize and empower my said Executors to change investments and to reinvest my personal estate and the proceeds arising from the sale of any of my real estate in such personal and real estate securities as they in their discretion may consider best.

I nominate and appoint my wife Mary J. Baldwin Guardian of my minor children. In witness whereof I the said Richard F. Baldwin have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of November anno Domini One thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty nine (1889).
