

and disposing mind memory and understanding do make and publish this as and for my last Will and Testament.

First: I direct my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses to be paid as soon as they conveniently can be after my decease.

Second: I direct my executor and trustee hereinafter named to collect from my interest in my partnership with Edward B. Amer trading as Am. Amer & Co. in the morocco business in the City of Philadelphia at the rate of six thousand dollars (\$6000) per year from the date of my death, permitting the remainder of my interest therein to continue therein until the same shall be entirely collected at the said rate, provided the said Edward B. Amer, upon my death secure the payment of said remainder when so due, to my executor hereinafter named.

Third: Subject thereto I give bequeath and devise all my property and estate, real, personal and mixed of every kind and wheresoever situate to the Equitable Trust Company of the City of Philadelphia absolutely and in fee simple I do Trust to pay over the one half of the net income thereof to my wife Bertrude for her life and the other half part thereof to my daughter Orial Taylor and upon the death of my wife to pay over the whole of said net income to my said daughter during her life so that the same shall not be liable for her debts or engagements or those of any husband whom she may have and upon her death to pay over transfer and deliver the principal thereof to such persons and in such interests as she shall by her last will appoint and in default of such appointment to her children and issue surviving her, in equal shares her shares absolutely and in fee simple.

Fourth: I nominate and appoint my wife guardian of the estate of my daughter Orial.

Fifth: I nominate and appoint the Equitable Trust Company executor of this my last Will and Testament.
