

Will of Jacob C. Freno

Be it Remembered that I Jacob C. Freno of the City of Philadelphia State of Pennsylvania Attorney at Law being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say.

First. I will that my funeral expenses and just debts be paid and discharged as soon after my decease as reasonable may be.

Item. After the payment of my funeral expenses and just debts I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Virginia C. Freno all my Estates Lands Tenements and Hereditaments Real and Personal Property of whatsoever kind and wheresoever situated in the State of Pennsylvania or State of New Jersey which I now have or in any manner entitled

To have and to hold the said Real and Personal Estate and Property Right Title and Interest unto my wife Virginia C. Freno her heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my wife Virginia C. Freno Executrix of this my last will and Testament. And I do hereby revoke annul and make void all former and other wills and Testaments heretofore by me made and do declare this only to be my last will and Testament.

In Witness Whereof I the said Jacob C. Freno the testator have hereunto set my hand and seal the Fourth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety three.
