

for the last remains of my dear sister Mary S. Smith and my niece Louisa Sashens.  
Item 3. do hereby direct that as soon as convenient after my death that my funeral  
expenses and those of my last illness be paid.

Item 4. In account of my love and affection for her do hereby give and bequeath  
to my wife Elizabeth E. Carter all the property I may possess at the time of my death  
be it real personal or mixed or any that may accrue from any source after death,  
for her sole use, and benefit for the period of her natural life save and excepting  
the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars with interest at 5% from January 1, 1918  
which sum shall be paid on her order or demand and shall form a part of her  
separate estate.

Item 5. In the event that my property situate in Atlantic City in the state of New  
Jersey is not sold at the time of my death I direct my executors to sell the same  
so long as a good and proper price can be obtained for it (the terms to be in the discre-  
tion of the executors) and that the net proceeds of the sale shall be deposited in a  
financially sound saving fund society or trust company for the benefit of my wife  
Elizabeth E. Carter until property in the city of Philadelphia unencumbered and  
yielding reasonable rental can be purchased, that upon the rents and profits  
thereof the my said wife may live comfortable.

Item 6. After the death of my wife Elizabeth E. Carter do hereby direct that the distribution  
of the remainder of my estate be as follows to wit:

Item 7. For my kindness toward me in life I give and bequeath to my dear  
sister Amelia Sashens the sum of two hundred (\$200) dollars.

Item 8. Give and bequeath to my dear niece Elizabeth H. Biddle the sum of two  
hundred (\$200) dollars.

Item 9. Give and bequeath to Charles Henry Biddle the sum of one hundred  
(\$100) dollars.

Item 10. I do hereby direct my executors to withdraw from my estate the sum of  
two hundred (\$200) to be held in trust for the benefit of William D. Daley  
to be applied to his education and to be paid as needed.

Item 11. After paying the bequests hereinbefore particularly described do hereby give  
and bequeath unto the City of Philadelphia my house situate on Lombard Street above  
19th Street in the city of Philadelphia the sum of three hundred dollars.

Item 12. Give and bequeath to William D. Daley's shares of the stock of the Phila-  
delphia, Md., and Supply Company

Item 13. Give and bequeath to Charles Carter 5 shares of the stock of the Enterprise Coal &  
Coke Co.

Item 14. Give and bequeath to Sarah A. Daley my burial lot in Merion Cemetery

permitting name particularly described.

Item 15. Give and bequeath to Samuel Carter my real estate situate in the State  
of Delaware.

Item 16. Of my household goods I give and bequeath to Sarah A. Daley and  
Charles E. Daley two fine chafing dishes.

Item 17. All of the china, glassware and cooking utensils I direct shall be equally  
divided between Sarah A. Daley, Louisa Sashens and Rachel Ann Carter.

Item 18. Of the remainder of my household furniture I direct shall be sold  
and the proceeds made a portion of my estate.

Item 19. Give and bequeath to my dear nephew Charles E. Daley my house  
situate 133 Addison Street in the city and County of Philadelphia for the  
period of his natural life and I direct that during his minority that my  
executors hold the said property in trust, applying the rents and profits  
toward payment of the debts and obligations of the property as they may  
occur or repairs of as a fund for his benefit until the event of his death.

Item 20. I be said property to revert to my estate. Of all the rest remainder  
and residue of my estate I do hereby give and bequeath share and share alike  
to my brothers Richard Carter and John Carter my sisters Mary Singie Smith,  
Mary E. Sashens, Sarah A. Daley and Louisa Sashens.

Item 21. In account of my confidence in them I appoint the following as the  
executors of this my will and Settlement. Elizabeth Carter, my wife, Andrew J. Claw-  
son and Daniel Carter and I direct that my wife agrees she be allowed to act  
by and serve without bond.
