

I give to Isabella, wife of Samuel H. Day, my diamond and ruby ring and my diamond earrings.

I give to William H. Day, son of my late husband, the diamond stick pin formerly belonging to his father.

I give to said Martin H. Day, Samuel H. Day and William H. Day, all books, albums and the family Bible, and all the jewelry not herein specifically disposed of, to be divided amongst them share and share alike.

I give to Margery Isabella Day, daughter of Samuel H. Day, the India shawl and lace shawl formerly belonging to her late grandmother, and the diamond bar pin containing five diamonds; also my piano.

I give to Conrad B. Day, Jr., son of Martin H. Day, the gold sleeve buttons with the diamond and ruby settings, formerly belonging to my husband.

I give to my friend Mrs. A. Skinner my diamond and emerald ring.

I give to Mary A. Pulton, sister of my late husband, the walnut table formerly belonging to her mother, the claw foot table and the table with the carved legs now in the sitting room of my Philadelphia residence; the two old arm-chairs, formerly used by her mother and father, and the bed <sup>table linen</sup> ~~linen~~, <sup>table linen</sup> ~~linen~~, down quilts (with the exception of the silk quilt hereinbefore mentioned) and all blankets and quilts belonging to me.

I give the bed room set of furniture in the third story of my house that belonged to me before I was married, including the wardrobe and little sofa, to Mary Galbraith, daughter of Mary A. Pulton.

I give to Emma J. Knoll, wife of Maximilian Knoll, my loquett glasses and chain.

I give to Maximilian Knoll, husband of Emma J. Knoll, my masquise diamond and sapphire ring.

I give to Peter Boyd, as a token of the friendship which my late husband and myself had for him, the amethyst set belonging to my said husband, consisting of sleeve buttons, three pins (one of which is a lady's pin) and three studs.

All the rest and remainder of my personal property, I order and direct my Executor to sell and convert into cash, and I also order and direct him to sell all of my real estate and to convert the same into cash as soon as possible after my decease, including the house that I own in Atlantic City, New Jersey; and for such purpose I authorize and empower him to sell the said real estate, either at public or private sale for such price and upon such terms as he shall deem proper, and to make, execute and deliver to the purchasers thereof good and sufficient deeds and assurances in the law to the same without liability

on the part of the purchaser to see to the application of the purchase money.

Out of the proceeds of the sale of my personal and real estate I give the following legacies to the persons and institutions hereinafter named, namely:

If my dog "Dandy" is living at the time of my death I give him absolutely unto Mary A. Eisenbise, and I also give her the sum of two hundred dollars, <sup>on condition</sup> that she keep and provide for him during his lifetime.

I give to my niece Mary Emma Ellice the sum of Five thousand dollars;

To my niece Ellenora B. Eisenbise the sum of Five thousand dollars;

To my friend and cousin Mary Ann Eisenbise of Reading, the sum of Five thousand dollars;

To Mary A. Pulton the sum of Six thousand dollars;

To Emma J. Knoll the sum of One thousand dollars;

To the Temple Presbyterian Church the sum of Two thousand dollars;

To the Presbyterian Home for Widows and single Women the sum of One thousand dollars;

To the Presbyterian Orphanage adjoining said Home, the sum of One thousand dollars;

To the Habnemann Medical College and Hospital the sum of One thousand dollars; and

To the Masonic Home of Pennsylvania, now located at 3333 N. Broad Street, Philadelphia, the sum of Two thousand dollars.

I direct all the gifts and legacies in my will shall be paid without deduction for or on account of any collateral inheritance or other tax.

All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I give to the Temple Presbyterian Church, to the Presbyterian Home for Widows and single Women, to the Presbyterian Orphanage, to the Habnemann Medical College and Hospital of Philadelphia, and to the Masonic Home of Pennsylvania, to be divided amongst them pro rata in accordance with the amounts of the legacies hereinabove given to them.

I nominate, constitute and appoint Peter Boyd of the City of Philadelphia, Executor of this my last will and testament.
