

June 9. 1903, make this my last will and testament  
 Item 1 My soul I commit to the hands of Almighty God  
 the Ruler of all things and who does all things well  
 Item 2 I do hereby direct that after my death my body be  
 buried in my lot (No 32) in Marion Cemetery situate in Mont-  
 gomery County in the State of Pennsylvania and it is my de-  
 sire and I do hereby further direct that in the event that  
 my beloved wife Elizabeth C. Carter should survive me that  
 she be buried in said lot and that a portion of the lot  
 aforesaid be reserved for the last remains of my dear sis-  
 ter Mary A. Smith and my niece Louisa Jackson  
 Item 3 I do hereby direct that as soon as convenient after  
 my death that my funeral expenses and those of my last  
 illness be paid.  
 Item 4 In account of my love and affection for her I do  
 hereby give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth C. Carter all  
 the property I may possess at the time of my death be it  
 real personal or mixed or any that may accrue from  
 any source after death, for her sole use and benefit for the  
 term of her natural life have and excepting the sum of two  
 hundred and fifty dollars with interest at 3% from January  
 1, 1898 which shall be paid on her order or demand  
 and shall form a part of her separate estate.  
 Item 5 In the event that my property situate in Atlantic  
 City in the State of New Jersey is not sold at the time of  
 my death I direct my Executors to sell the same as soon  
 as a good and proper price can be obtained for it (the  
 terms to be in the discretion of the Executors) and that the  
 net proceeds of the sale shall be deposited in a financially  
 sound Savings Fund Society or Trust Company for the bene-  
 fit of my wife Elizabeth C. Carter until property in the City  
 of Philadelphia unencumbered and yielding reasonable rent  
 can be purchased, that upon the rents and profits  
 thereof she my said wife may live comfortable.  
 Item 6 After the death of my wife Elizabeth C. Carter I do  
 hereby direct that the distribution of the remainder of my  
 estate be as follows to wit:  
 Item 1 For her kindness toward me in life I give and be-  
 queath to my dear sister Amelia Thomas the sum of two  
 hundred (\$200) dollars  
 Item 2 I give and bequeath to my dear niece Elizabeth  
 Biddle the sum of two hundred (\$200) dollars  
 Item 3 I give and bequeath to Charles Henry Biddle the  
 sum of one hundred (\$100) dollars  
 Item 4 I do hereby direct my Executors to withdraw from  
 my estate the sum of two hundred (\$200) dollars to be held  
 in trust for the benefit of William D. Dale to be applied to  
 his education and to be paid as needed  
 Item 5 After paying the bequests hereinbefore particular-  
 ly recited I do hereby give and bequeath unto the Allen  
 M. C. Church now situate on Lombard Street above

19th Street in the City of Philadelphia, the sum of three  
 hundred dollars  
 Item 12 I give and bequeath to William D. Dale 3 shares  
 of the stock of the Phila. Paterns Mfg. and Supply Company  
 Item 13 I give and bequeath to Charles Carter 5 shares of the  
 stock of the Enterprise Coal Co  
 Item 14 I give and bequeath to Sarah A. Dale my burial lot  
 in Marion Cemetery hereinbefore more particularly described  
 Item 15 I give and bequeath to Samuel Carter my real estate  
 situate in the State of Delaware  
 Item 16 Of my household goods I give and bequeath to Sarah  
 A. Dale and Charles E. Dale two fine China cups  
 Item 17 All of the China, glassware and cooking utensils I  
 possess shall be equally divided between Sarah A. Dale, Louisa  
 Jackson and Charles E. Dale  
 Item 18 Of the remainder of my household furniture I direct  
 shall be sold and the proceeds made a portion of my estate  
 Item 19 I give and bequeath to my dear nephew Charles  
 E. Dale my house situate 1133 Addison Street in the City  
 and County of Philadelphia for the period of his natural  
 life and I direct that during his minority that my  
 Executors hold the said property in trust, applying the  
 rents and profits. For the payment of the debts and  
 obligations of the property as they may accrue & to repairs  
 & as a fund for his benefit in the event of his death.  
 Item 20 The said property to revert to my estate  
 if all the rest remainder and residue of my estate I do  
 hereby give and bequeath share and share alike to my  
 brothers Richard Carter and John Carter my sister Mary Louie  
 Smith, Mary A. Silaham, Sarah A. Dale and Louisa Jackson  
 Item 21 In pursuance of my confidence in them I appoint  
 the following as the Executors of this my will and Testament  
 Elizabeth Carter my wife, Andrew J. Claver and Samuel  
 Carter and I direct that my wife aforesaid be allowed to  
 qualify and serve without bond.
