Application having been made to me by Josiah H. Freeman the executor named in the last will and testament of Albert A. Freeman, late of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey deceased, for probate of the said will and testament and letters testamentary thereon, and the Surrogate having inquired into the circumstances and taken the proofs and being satisfied of the genuineness of the said will, produced, the validity of its execution, and the competency of the testator, and the probate of the said will not being contested and it appearing that the testator died more than ten days ago to-wit: Dec 30, 1910.

It is on this sixth day of February A. D. 1911, adjudged that the instrument offered for probate in this matter is established as the last will and testament of Albert A. Freeman deceased and the same is hereby admitted to probate; and it is ordered that letters testamentary be issued thereon.
