nounced and that I am the residuary legatee named in
said will and that I will well and faithfully administer
the personal estate and effects of the said deceased by pay-
ing his just debts and the legacies contained in his will
and distributing the residue of his estate according to law
that I will exhibit a true and perfect inventory of all
and singular the said personal estate and effects and
render a just and true account thereof whenever required
by law so to do that the testator died at Cummer aforesaid
on the twenty-fourth day of December 1874 and that the
said testator at the time of his death had a fixed place
of abode at Cummer aforesaid within the District of Cork
and that the whole of the personal estate and effects of the
said deceased does not amount in value to the sum
of six hundred pounds to the best of my knowledge
information and belief.
