IV. I nominate, constitute and appoint The Safe Deposit and Trust Company, a corporation under and by virtue of the Laws of the State of Maryland, and having its principal place of business in the City of Baltimore, in said State, the executor of this my last Will and Testament and trustee to carry out the trusts hereinabove set forth and provided.
