One third thereof to my beloved wife, Alice B. Scott, The remaining two thirds and the whole, if my wife shall predecease me, to my beloved children, Annie R. Scott, Edith Breyer, wife of Harry W. Breyer, Edward R. Scott, Wilbur S. Scott and Victor T. Scott, in equal shares, the descendants of any then dead to take the ancestors share per stirpes

Lastly. I nominate, constitute and appoint as the Executor of this my last will and testament, The Pennsylvania Company for Insurances on Lives and Granting Annuities and do confer upon such executor power at any time to do all or any of the things following;

1. To sell any real estate which may at any time form part of my estate for such prices upon such terms, in such way and manner and for such interests and estates as to it or them may seem proper and to make good deeds therefor to the purcheers without any liability on the part of the latter to see to or be responsible for the application of the purchase money.

- 2. To let on ground rent, mortgage, square, exchange or join in the partition of real estate and to let or demise the same.
- 3. To invest and reinvest, alter, vary and change investments and reinvestments from time to time at discretion not being confined to what are known as "Legal Investments"
