Tenth. I give, devise and bequeath to my nephew, Artemas Ward, Jr., my bonds in the Wayside Mining Company and my shares of stock in the Atlas Corporation, with any accrued interest on the same.

Eleventh. I give and devise my house and lot in Hammonton, New Jersey, to my niece Martina T. Robinson, absolutely and in fee, subject to a mortgage of One thousand Dollars held by my brother-in-law Artemas Ward.

Twelfth. I give and bequeath to my sister, Mrs Rebecca D. Ward, the following articles now in my house in Hammonton, New Jersey, namely, the Victor Machine, the parlor chandelier, the one in my brother's room, given to him by Artemas Ward, Jr., the vases in parlor and dining rooms, all of the bed-room furniture and bedding, except the set in my room, and her choice of any of the furniture in the parlor and dining room; and the balance of the articles in said house, including my writing desk, chamber set and chinaware, I give and bequeath to my niece Martina T. Robinson.

Thirteenth. Any balance that may remain on deposit in my bank after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I give and bequeath to my niece, Katharine Y. Field.

Fourteenth. I give, devise and bequeath, absolutely and in fee, subject to the charge mentioned in paragraph six of my will, the Farm in Montgomery County, Pa., known as Cedar Mount, as follows: To my sister, Mrs Rebecca D. Ward, the undivided  $\frac{4}{8}$ th of said farm; to my nephews Samuel M. Robinson and John J. Robinson the undivided  $\frac{1}{8}$ th share and share alike; to the daughters of my deceased niece, Mrs Read J. McKay, the undivided  $\frac{1}{8}$ th share and share alike, the children to take the parent's share; the undivided  $\frac{2}{8}$ th to Margaret Elliot and Rebecca W. Elliot, daughters of my nephew, James H. Elliot, share and share alike, if, however, my said sister desires to retain the said farm, and will pay the above mentioned fractional share in cash upon an agreed valuation to the persons entitled, then upon payment being made, the whole of said farm I give, devise and bequeath to my said sister. I direct that all of my pecuniary legacies shall, if necessary, be charged upon my farm known as Cedar Mount.

Fifteenth. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real and personal, I give devise and bequeath to my sister, Mrs Rebecca D. Ward.

Sixteenth. I appoint my nephew Artemus Ward, Jr., Executor of this my last will and testament.
