

THIRD: I give and bequeath to Harry Barr, of Germantown, the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000), to be invested by my executor in approved securities, and the income thereof to be paid to him during his life. Upon his decease the principal of the legacy shall revert to my name-sake, Anna D. Riddle.

FOURTH: I give and bequeath to my friend, Mary Roosa, my diamond ring with raised diamond setting.

FIFTH: I give and bequeath to my friend, Mary Nixon, of Patterson, New Jersey, a piece of jewelry to be selected by my son.

SIXTH: I give and bequeath to my son, Robert N. Riddle my lot in Laurel Hill Cemetery, subject to the previous provision relating to said lot.

SEVENTH: I give and bequeath to Eleanor S. Riddle, wife of my son, Robert N. Riddle, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000).

EIGHTH: All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed, of whatever character, of which I may be possessed at the time of my decease I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved, son, Robert N. Riddle, if he survive me, and if he do not survive me then to his wife, Eleanor S. Riddle, during her life, and at her death to my son's children share and share alike, but the principal of the residue shall not be given to them until they respectively arrive at the age of thirty-five years, but this provision is not intended to interfere with the provision for my son, if he survive me.

LASTLY: I nominate, constitute and appoint my son, Robert N. Riddle, to be the executor of my estate, with full power and authority to sell and convey and convert into money all my estate which he may deem necessary, including real estate, and to make, execute and deliver all necessary deeds and conveyances to transfer the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof at public or private sale, for such price or prices as my said executor may consider satisfactory, and free from liability in the purchaser or purchasers to see or attend to the proper application of the purchase money.
