Fifth- If my wife Sarah be deceased at the time of my death I give & bequeath to her niece Lizzie P. Rese daughter of George S. Grubb and Mary his late wife the sum of Thirty nine hundred and twenty four 50/100 dollars that being all I have received from my wife's family. If my wife survive me this bequest to be null & void.

Sixth- I give and bequeath to my grandson James Sherron son of my son James F. Sherron my double barrelled gun; also to my son himself the watch I now carry and the watch which belonged to my great grandfather James Sherron.

Seventh- I give devise and bequeath to my grandson and executor Wilfred Patterson of Philadelphia in fee simple all the rest residue and remainder of my estate (not heretofore bequeathed) real personal or mixed in Trust for my beloved daughter Helen L. Suddards for term of her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between her two sons Wilfred and James S. Patterson share and share alike to hold to them and their heirs and should either of them be dead at the death of my said daughter the survivor to take the whole to him and his heirs forever.

Eighth. And I do hereby make constitute and appoint my grandson Wilfred Patterson Executor of this my Last will and Testament in addition to the powers as trustee conferred upon him in the preceding section.-
