

In the matter of the Estate of Fredericka Schneider deceased, Responding Comd.

Know all men by these presents, That I, Fredericka Leiner of the city of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and state of New York, am held and firmly bound unto Valentine P. Hoffmann the executor of the last Will and Testament of Fredericka Schneider deceased, in the sum of Three hundred and eight dollars and four cents (\$308.04) lawful money of the United States, to be paid to him, his successors in office or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made I bind myself, my heirs, executors, and administrators. Sealed with my seal, and dated this 6th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

It appears the above named Fredericka Schneider did by her last Will and Testament, duly proved before the Surrogate of the county of Atlantic and state of New Jersey on the 29th day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, give, devise and bequeath her estate, real personal and mixed, as follows to wit: Twenty five dollars each to Fritz and Henry Genge, Fifty dollars to the Johns German Reformed Church of Egg Harbor City, to my beloved nephew Henry F. Heber of Northport L.I. in the state of New York, the certain mortgage for the sum of Eight hundred dollars given by Conrad Heuman of Calloway township in the county of Atlantic state of New Jersey held by me.

And whereas further she did give and bequeath, that all the rest residue and remainder of my estate both, real and personal, be equally divided between my beloved nephew Henry F. Heber of Northport L.I. in the state of New York his heirs, and assigns, and Fritz Leiner, a nephew of my deceased husband Oscar Schneider residing in Brooklyn, Kings County, state of New York, his heirs or assigns.

And whereas it has been shown to the satisfaction of the said Valentine P. Hoffmann executor aforesaid and to the Clapham Court of the county of Atlantic, that the said Fritz Leiner has since died to wit on the eighth day of June A.D. 1905 and that he left his wife surviving this only son, and heir at law, the above named Fredericka Leiner.

And whereas the rest, residue and remainder of the estate of the said Fredericka Schneider deceased, did amount to the sum of Six hundred and sixteen dollars and nine cents, which said sum was ordered to be distributed between the said Henry F. Heber and the said Fritz Leiner or to their respective heirs, by a decree of distribution dated January 26th 1909. And whereas the said, the above named Fredericka Leiner being the heir of Fritz Leiner deceased, give devise and bequeath to him the sum of Three hundred and eight dollars and four cents, and did therein also appoint the above named Valentine P. Hoffmann the executor thereof.

Now the condition of the obligation is such, that if any debt or debts truly owing by the said testator, shall be hereafter and for and verified or otherwise duly made to appear, which shall be or other cause to pay, that I, and in every such case of the said Fredericka Leiner

shall refund and pay back to the said Valentine P. Hoffmann, executor as aforesaid, his notable part of such debt or debts, and of the costs of suit and charges, by reason of such debt or debts, out of the part of share as aforesaid received by him, thereby to enable the said executor to satisfy such debt or debts, then the above obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
