It appearing that the Guarantee Trust Company administrator of the Estate of Charles J. Lake, deceased, has made report to this Court of the several claims and demands exhibited against said estate and that said administrator exhibited therewith under oath a true and just account of the moneys, goods and chattels, rights and credits of the said decedent which have come to its knowledge, hands or possession and also an inventory of the real estate of said decedent which has come to its knowledge and the value thereof; and it further appearing that the said Guarantee Trust Company administrator, as aforesaid, gave due notice to the creditors of the aforesaid estate to exhibit their claims and of its intention to make such report and to apply for a decree adjudging the said estate to be insolvent pursuant to the order of this Court and the statute in such case made and provided; and it appearing that said report was filed in the Surrogate's office of the said County of Atlantic twenty days before the day named for presenting the same; and it further appearing that no exceptions have been filed to the aforesaid report of claims, account of inventory and the Court having considered the amount of the personal and real estate and the value thereof and it appearing to the Court that the real and personal estate is insufficient to pay the debts and that the said estate is likely to be insolvent.

Lake, deceased, from time to time as may appear expedient according to the form of the statute in such case made and provided.
