Report of Sale.

To the Orphans' Court of the County of Atlantic:

Report of the sale of land made by Frank De Luca, administrator of Edward Reiny, deceased, pursuant to an order of this Court made on the Eleventh day of April, A.D. 1905, and a further order of the Orphans' Court of the County of Cumberland, made on the Twenty-first day of April, A.D. 1905. The said administrator having given notice of the sale of the said land to be made in front of the Baker House Hotel, on Landis Avenue, between Sixth and Seventh Streets, in the Borough of Vineland, and County of Cumberland on the Third day of June, instant, at the hour of two in the afternoon, by public advertisement signed by himself and set up at five or more public places in each of said Counties, one or more whereof was in the Townships where such lands are situate, for the space of four weeks next before the time appointed for the sale thereof, and having caused the same to be published in the Atlantic Review and the Mail's Landing Record, two newspapers printed and published in the County of Atlantic, one of which is printed and published at Mail's Landing, the County seat of the said County of Atlantic, and also published in the Evening Journal and the Bridgton Pioneer, two newspapers printed and published in the County of Cumberland, one of which is printed and published at Bridgton, the County seat of the said County of Cumberland, for four weeks successively, once a week, next preceding the time appointed for selling the same, at the time and place so advertised, sold the same, by public vendue, to the highest bidder. Said land being a certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate in the Township of Arena Vista, in the County of Atlantic and in the Township of Landis, in the County of Cumberland and bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning in the centre of Chestnut Avenue at a distance of fifty-seven and sixty-eight hundredths rods Westwardly of the centres of said Chestnut Avenue and Union Road, and thence extending Westwardly along the centre of said Chestnut Avenue forty rods; and thence between parallel lines in length or depth Southwardly eighty rods, containing Twenty Acres of Land, was sold to Charles J. Scaglia, the highest bidder, for the sum of One Thousand and Five Dollars.

Decree confirming sale.

Report having been made to this Court by Frank De Luca administrator of Edward Reiny, deceased, of the sale of land pursuant to the order of this Court made on the Eleventh day of April A.D. 1905 and the further order of

The Orphans' Court of the County of Cumberland made on the twenty-first day of April, A.D. 1905, whereby it appears that the said Administrator duly advertised the time and place of sale according to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and did at the time and place so advertised, sell the same by public vendue to the highest bidder, and said land being a certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate in the Township of Arena Vista, in the County of Atlantic and the Township of Landis in the County of Cumberland and bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning in the centre of Chestnut Avenue at a distance of fifty-seven and sixty-eight hundredths rods Westwardly of the centres of said Chestnut Avenue and Union Road and thence extending Westwardly along the centre of said Chestnut Avenue forty rods; and thence between parallel lines in length or depth Southwardly eighty rods, containing Twenty Acres of Land, was sold to Charles J. Scaglia for the sum of One Thousand and Five Dollars, and no objections being made to such sale, and the same having been confirmed by the Orphans' Court of the County of Cumberland on the Fifth day of June, A.D. 1905, it is approved by this Court as valid and effectual in law, and it is ordered and directed that the said Frank De Luca, administrator, execute a good and sufficient conveyance in law to the purchaser for the said land so sold as aforesaid.
