

after letters of administration were granted appraisers were appointed and made their inventory and appraisement, which was duly filed in the office of the Surrogate of Atlantic County on November 13th, nineteen hundred and five; that at the time said inventory and appraisement was made said administrator believed that Anna Miller, widow of decedent, was not entitled to her exemption, and therefore the appraisers were not sworn before entering upon the performance of their duties;

And it further appearing to the court from the said petition that the said widow is entitled to her exemption under the law as the widow of said decedent;

It is, thereupon, on this sixth day of February, A.D. nineteen hundred and six, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the inventory and appraisement heretofore made in the above entitled cause be and the same is hereby set aside as null and void, and of no effect in law.

It is further ordered adjudged and decreed that appraisers be appointed by the Surrogate of Atlantic County to appraise the personal estate of said decedent, and that before entering upon the performance of their duties as such appraisers, they be duly sworn according to law, as is required in cases where an exemption is to be allowed.

The petition of Albert B. Stephany respectfully shows that he is the substituted administrator with the will annexed of Jacob Mueller deceased, and that your petitioner has in his hands the sum of over twelve hundred dollars, which he is required by the terms of said will to retain until certain minor children of Christian Mueller, nephew of Jacob Mueller deceased shall attain their majority, and that the estate in his hands will be materially benefited by the proper investment of said sum at interest, and your petitioner further shows that one Charles H. Bull of Atlantic City, New Jersey, is willing to borrow of your petitioner the sum of Eleven Hundred Dollars for the period of three years at six per cent interest, and offer as security therefor his bond and a first mortgage on his property situate in the Borough of Pleasantville, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the westerly side of Second Avenue Three Hundred and twenty feet from the northerly side of the Pleasantville and Atlantic City Turnpike, thence running (1) Westwardly, parallel with said Turnpike, one hundred and fifty feet to an alley or back street; thence (2) Northwardly and parallel with said Second Avenue along said alley, forty feet; thence (3) Eastwardly, parallel with the said Turnpike one hundred and fifty feet to the westerly line of Second Avenue; thence (4) Southwardly, along said Avenue, forty feet, to the place of beginning.

And your petitioner further shows that he has made diligent inquiry among persons acquainted with the values of real estate in that vicinity and has been advised that said property is worth over the sum of seventeen hundred dollars. Your petitioner therefore prays the direction of the said court in the premises.
