

Atlantic County Orphans Court.
Intestate Decree.

In the matter of the estate of Henry R. Albertson, deceased.

The account of Clarence F. Albertson, administrator of the estate of Henry R. Albertson, deceased, having been duly audited and stated by the surrogate and allowed by this Court, and it appeared by the said account that the sum of Four hundred & ninety-six dollars and twenty-one cents remains after payment of the debts, funeral charges and just expenses, and it having been proved to the satisfaction of the Court that the said Henry R. Albertson left his two children, to wit, Ella C. Evans and Elizabeth R. Albertson him surviving as his only next of kin, it is thereupon on this twentieth day of February, A. D., nineteen hundred and seven, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the aforesaid sum be distributed and paid to the aforesaid children and next of kin of the said Henry R. Albertson as follows, to wit:

One half part thereof, amounting to the sum of Two hundred forty eight & 1/100 dollars, to Ella C. Evans, one of the children of the said Henry R. Albertson, deceased; and the remaining one-half part thereof, amounting to the sum of Two hundred forty eight & 1/100 dollars to the said Elizabeth R. Albertson, the other child of the said Henry R. Albertson, deceased.

Atlantic County Orphans Court.

In the matter of the application of Harry S. Parsons and Edith Parsons for leave to adopt Maud Fernwick Hudson Campbell a minor.

Decree permitting adoption.

Whereas Harry S. Parsons and Edith Parsons, his wife, on the Thirteenth day of February, 1907 presented their petition to this court, setting forth that they reside at Atlantic City, Atlantic County, New Jersey; that the said Harry S. Parsons is by occupation a Manager; that the age of the said Harry S. Parsons is twenty-nine years, and the age of Edith Parsons is twenty-nine years; that they desire to adopt Maud Fernwick Hudson Campbell, a minor child, aged twenty-two months, who resides in the City of Atlantic City, County of Atlantic and is now living with the petitioners; that the parent of said child Elizabeth Campbell gave her consent in writing to such adoption; that the said child has no property whatsoever, and praying the court might give its consent to such adoption, and that the court would inquire into the merits of the said petition, and would by its decree grant permission to the said Harry S. Parsons and Edith Parsons to adopt said child, and that the court would change the name of said child to Billian Marie Parsons; to which there was annexed an affidavit of the said petitioners duly verified according to law; and the written consent of Elizabeth Campbell, the mother of the said Maud Fernwick Hudson Campbell, duly acknowledged.

Whereupon and upon reading the said petition and affidavit and consent, the court ordered that the same be filed with the clerk of this court, and the same were filed accordingly; and the court having fixed Thursday the Twenty-eighth day of February, 1907, for a hearing of said petition and the examination of the parties in interest; and whereas, upon the day so appointed the court did proceed to a full hearing of the petition and of the examination of the petitioners, under oath, and the court, from the testimony, is of the opinion that the facts stated in the petition are true, and upon the said examination is satisfied that the petitioners are of good moral character and of reputable standing in the community, and of ability to properly maintain and educate said child, reference being had to the degree and condition in life of the child's parent, and furthermore that the best interests of the child would be promoted by such adoption.

Now, therefore, the court doth, by virtue of said act, order, adjudge and decree that the prayer of the said petitioners be and the same is hereby granted, and that the said Maud Fernwick Hudson Campbell, minor child of Elizabeth Campbell shall hereafter be known by the name of Billian Marie Parsons; and the court doth hereby declare and adjudge that from the date of this decree the rights, duties, privileges and relations heretofore existing between the said Maud F. H. Campbell and her parent Elizabeth Campbell, shall be and are in all respects at an end, excepting the right of inheritance, and further, that the rights, duties, privileges and relations between the said
