It is thereupon, on this tenth day of July one thousand nine hundred and eight ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said sale be and the same is hereby confirmed as valid and effectual in law and it is further ordered that the said George W. Harman, Executor, as aforesaid execute good and sufficient conveyances in the law to the said Walter Chase, Smith E. Johnson, Charles S. Adams, Rose Slow and Thomas Payne for the land so purchased by them as aforesaid upon their complying with the conditions of said sale.
