In the matter of the Appointment of a guardian for Caroline Connor, a lunatic.

Order appointing guardian

Upon reading and filing the duly verified petition of Joanna Connor and John Clay, wherein they set forth that Caroline Connor is a lunatic confined in the Atlantic County Asylum for the insane, that she is possessed of property valued at less than one thousand dollars, that they are the only children and heirs at law of said lunatic and also set out in the affidavit to said petition that they are willing and request that Joanna Connor be made the guardian of the person and property of said lunatic.

It is on this eighth day of March, A.D. nineteen hundred and nine, ordered that the guardianship of the person and property of said Caroline Connor, lunatic, be committed to the said Joanna Connor and that letters of Guardianship be issued accordingly, the said guardian first giving bond in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, with Richard Boy and Christa Connor as sureties, for the faithful execution of her office according to law.

In the matter of the Estate of Jane H. Price, deceased.

Petition

To The Cliphans Court of the County of Atlantic, in the State of New Jersey.

The Petitioner Harry H. Price of the City of Atlantic City, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey respectfully sheweth: 1. That Jane H. Price, mother of your petitioner, departed this life in said Atlantic County on the twenty-sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and six, leaving a last will and testament dated the twelfth day of April, eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, wherein she created a trust estate, and whereby your petitioner was made a beneficiary thereof, and whereby Joseph Burrer was appointed trustee to execute the said will, in the following language, to wit:

"All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed, of whatsoever name and nature, and wheresoever situate, devise and bequeath to my daughter, Mary A. Holden, and to Joseph Burrer in trust for my son, Harry H. Price, as follows: - one half to go to my said daughter, Mary A. Holden, absolutely, and the other half to Joseph Burrer, of the City of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, in trust for the said Harry H. Price, who shall receive the interest on the value of such estate, payable, annually, no part of the principal of said estate shall be paid to the said Harry H. Price, but at his death the said estate shall pass to my said daughter, Mary A. Holden, or her heirs."

2. That on the twentieth day of October, nineteen hundred and six, the said Joseph Burrer under his hand and seal duly acknowledged, renounced his right of trusteeship in the said will, which said renunciation is on file in the Office of the Sursogate of the County of Atlantic, at Trump Landing, New Jersey.

3. That after the aforesaid renunciation of the said Joseph Burrer, the Cliphans Court of the County of Atlantic, pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided, did upon petition of your petitioner, on the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and six, appoint Milton L. Munson of the City of Atlantic City, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey substituted administrator and trustee under said will to execute the said will and the trust created thereby.

4. That the said Milton L. Munson assumed the duties of Administration and Trusteeship and that there came to his hand to be held in trust for your petitioner the sum of Ten Thousand dollars, arising from the sale of the residue of the real and personal estate of the said Jane H. Price, as provided in her last will and testament aforesaid.

5. That the said Milton L. Munson, without the authority of this Court, and without any authority save that set forth in his will as Trustee, took the said sum of Ten Thousand Dollars to one Charles W. McDonnell, and as if said sum were the property of said Milton L. Munson.
