In the matter of the estate of Charles Watson, deceased, Decree alleged to be inchoate

The surrogate having audited and stated the account of Martha Teal, administratrix of the estate of Charles S. Watson, deceased, and placed the same on the files of said office twenty day previous to the twenty first day of July, 1909, and having on the day last aforesaid, reported the same for approval and settlement, and it having been proved to the satisfaction of this court that notice of her intention to settle her account on the twenty first day of July, 1909, in this court was given by said accountants, according to law, and the court have examined the said account, and the vouchers and receipts of payments, and disbursements claimed therein, and having found the same to be correct in all particulars, and it further appearing by the report of the said administratrix, made on the sixteenth day of June, 1909, that the claims duly exhibited against the said estate amount to the sum of three thousand one hundred ninety one dollar and twenty one cents, to which report no exceptions were made, and it appearing by the account now presented by the said administratrix for allowance, as aforesaid, that the proceeds of the personal and real estate of the said Charles S. Watson deceased, which have come to the hands of the said administratrix, deducting therefrom prepaid debts and allowances, amounts to the sum of two thousand four hundred six dollars and thirty seven cents, and it further appearing that no exceptions have been made to the above mentioned account of said administratrix;

It is thereupon on this twenty first day of July, 1909 ordered adjudged and decreed that the account of the said Martha Teal, administratrix aforesaid, last above mentioned, be and the same hereby is in all things allowed as reported, and it is further ordered and decreed that the aforesaid sum of two thousand four hundred six dollars and thirty seven cents be distributed and paid by the said administratrix to the said creditors in the proportions of seventy five and thirty seven hundredths cents to each dollar due them respectively, according to the aforesaid report.

In the matter of the estate of Oliver M. Packard, deceased, Decree of Distribution

The Final Account of the Guaranty Trust Company and Virginia S. Packard, Administrators of the Estate of Oliver M. Packard, deceased, having been duly audited and stated by the surrogate and allowed by this court, and it appearing by the said account that the sum of twenty-nine hundred seventy-four and 3/4 Dollars remains after payment of debts, funeral charges, just expenses and an advancement made on account of the distributive share to which Virginia S. Packard is entitled, and it having been proved to the satisfaction of the court that the said Oliver M. Packard left his wife, Virginia S. Packard, a daughter, and Nathaniel R. Packard, a son, him surviving, as his only next of kin.

And it further appearing that the above balance in the hands of the administrators aforesaid, is represented as follows:

And it also appearing that the said Virginia S. Packard has agreed to accept the above stocks and promissory notes in lieu of cash to the amount of their valuation, as stated in said account, and it further appearing that the sum of Two Hundred Dollars has been heretofore paid to the said Virginia S. Packard, on account of her distributive share of said estate.

It is thereupon on this twenty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, ordered, adjudged and decreed that to the above balance there should be added the sum of Two hundred Dollars, previously advanced, and that the following division of the same be made:

One-third part thereof, less Two Hundred Dollars previously advanced, to the said Virginia S. Packard, widow of the said Oliver M. Packard; a portion of which one-third is to be paid in the securities and promissory notes above named. One-third part thereof to the said Virginia M. Packard, and One-third part thereof to the said Nathaniel R. Packard, as soon as a guardian shall be appointed for said children, both of whom are minors.
