DECLARATION OF INTENTION

Invalid for all purposes seven years after the date hereof

I, Anton Terlan, aged 23 years, occupation salesman, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color white, complexion light, height 5 feet 7 inches, weight 145 pounds, color of hair brown, color of eyes grey, other visible distinctive marks none

I was born in Kersbergem Germany on the 6th day of May, anno Domini 1893; I now reside at 1403 Memorial Ave. Atlantic City, New Jersey
I emigrated to the United States of America from Bremen Germany on the vessel Kron Prince Wilhelm; my last foreign residence was Elberfeld Germany

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to William 2nd German Emperor, of whom I am now a subject; I arrived at the port of New York City, in the State of New York, on or about the 15th day of May, anno Domini 1902; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
SO HELP ME GOD.
