occupation Merchant, do declare on oath that my personal  
description is: Color White, complexion Dark, height 5 feet 8 inches,  
weight 184 pounds, color of hair Brown, color of eyes Brown,  
other visible distinctive marks none.

I was born in Odessa, Russia,  
on the 6th day of December, anno Domini 1886. I now reside  
at 715 Atlantic Ave. Atlantic City, N.J.

I emigrated to the United States of America from London, England  
on the vessel Parisian and Grand Duke, my last  
foreign residence was Montreal, Canada.

(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)  
I am married; the name  
of my wife is Esther; she was born at Odessa, Russia

and now resides at 715 Atlantic Ave. Atlantic City, N.J.  
It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign  
prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the Present Form of  
Government of Russia, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of Montreal, in the  
State of Canada, on or about the 15th day  
of August, anno Domini 1907; I am not an anarchist; I am not a  
polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith  
to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:  
SO HELP ME GOD.
