description is: Color White, complexion Fair, height 5 feet 4 inches,
weight 130 pounds, color of hair Black, color of eyes Brown
other visible distinctive marks Mustache

I was born in Messina Italy
on the 6th day of April, anno Domini 1878. I now reside
at Hammonden New Jersey

I emigrated to the United States of America from Messina Italy
on the vessel Columbia; my last
foreign residence was Messina Italy; I am un married; the name

of my wife is Mary Antonino; she was born at Messina Italy

prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel
3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;
