I, Loreto Di Giovanni, aged 27 years, occupation Freight Hand, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color White, complexion medium, height 5 feet 6 inches, weight 150 pounds, color of hair Brun, color of eyes Blue other visible distinctive marks

I was born in Macchia, Salerno Italy on the 15th day of February, anno Domini 1897; I now reside at 117 1/2 No. Mississippi Ave. Atlantic City, N.J.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Naples Italy on the vessel Madonna, my last foreign residence was Macchia, Salerno; I am married; the name of my wife is Carmella Di Giovanni, she was born at Atlantic City, N.J. and now resides at 117 1/2 No. Mississippi Ave. Atlantic City, N.J.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel 3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York City in the State of New York on or about the 15th day of April, anno Domini 1907. I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.
