Los Angeles, Cal.—When the big Iron gates of the penitentiary at San Quentin, Cal., clanged shut on Walter Lipps, former deputy sheriff of Los Angeles the final chapter was written in the rime career of Joe Furey, king of bunco men. It also ended the strange story of a victim of Furey, a nemesis who irove the confidence man to his grave.

Famous as a Swindler. Heading the best organized hand of "bunco-steerers" in America, Furey op-erated from coast to coast, bought poilco protection and stole millions of dollars.
