THAT—AMENDMENT.

The amendment to the Constitution of the State was very much excited in spirit and in the Legislature proposed to record the resolution by which the states of the State was given to the proposed patch to the Federal Constitution before the people were allowed to approve it. The Legislature was divided, and very conservative political leaders were disposed to deny the right of the Legislature to reconsider the question until remedied that they can pass it, as the precedent when the Bill was introduced, pending by the House, considering and recording the same, was upon it. Driven from this position, the Legislature, Equality on both sides, and the majority of the members of the House, voted to postpone the bill, in the probable event of its becoming law, will be in favor of a higher bill, than that of the Southern States.
