FRELINGHUYSEN ON FARMERS' NEEDS

He Speaks to Conference About More Profitable Agriculture.

UPHOLDS MODERN IDEAS.

State School Board, of Which He is Vice President, Thoroughly in Accord With Anything That Produces Better Results For Children of Agriculturists and of Other Residents of New Jersey.

New Brunswick, N. J., Dec. 29.—Farmers from every county in the state were in attendance at the "Soils and Crops day," the second in the annual conference which was planned by the late E. B. Voorhees, the former director of the state experimental station here, and Franklin Dye, secretary of the state board of agriculture.

The Hon. Joseph S. Frelinghuysen, president of the state board of agriculture and vice president of the state board of education, was the chairman of today's session. The topic of his address was "A More Profitable Agriculture in New Jersey," and, while he told the farmers much about the trend of the times being "back to the soil," he gave a comprehensive and interesting review of the public school system.

The senator spoke of what was being accomplished in the state in agricultural and vocational training and said that a better education for the boys brought up on the farm would fit them for a life of independence and comfort and make them proud of their calling. He brought out the fact that the sustenance of the people was of far greater importance than any other line of endeavor.

Throughout his address it was apparent that Senator Frelinghuysen, as a farmer himself, had a clear idea of the farmer's viewpoint, particularly with reference to the cost of the maintenance of the school system in the shape of taxes. In a comprehensive review of the school situation for ten years Senator Frelinghuysen described many of the weak points of the system before its reorganization. He said it was a known fact that many schools were unfit for the school children, that financial matters were handled with gross carelessness, there was little co-operation from the school department, the sale of bonds was controlled by a few brokers, the railroads were allowed a year to pay taxes—in brief, he reviewed thoroughly the conditions that brought about the investigation and reorganization of the system.

High Tribute to Associates. Some of the things that had already been accomplished by way of contrast were described. The senator paid a high tribute to Calvin N. Kendall, the state commissioner, and his assistants, J. Brognard Betts, Albert B. Meredith, J. J. Bavitz, Lewis N. Carrick, Thomas D. Sensor and Herbert N. Morse.

That a better relationship between the state body and the many local boards of education exists was shown by the senator, and the spirit of co-operation that is thus fostered is helpful. He mentioned the higher standard of teaching as having a good effect throughout the state and spoke of the fact that practically all of the county superintendents endorsed the state board and its excellent work.

He said the state board advocated an additional normal school for south Jersey, which he hoped might be realized in the near future. He spoke of the

excellent work done by the summer schools. The raising of the qualifications of the teachers had succeeded.

Senator Frelinghuysen impressed upon his hearers the fact that the present state board of education was strong in its advocacy for better training in the "three R's." He said that much had been accomplished by the removal of the defective children from many of the schools, which was of benefit to the normal children as well as the unfortunates, and that the board had done its best to bring about a wider use of the school buildings by the people for community purposes.

Children's Lives Better Protected. He said that the lives of the children of the state were better protected than formerly because of the more rigid requirements in the matter of fireproof construction of schools. "I will not, so long as I am in any way responsible, give my consent that schools may be built in a flimsy or unsafe manner, even though the platform of every political party should explicitly so declare," he said.

After speaking of some of the excellent results that had followed the establishment of a thorough medical inspection in the schools, the senator declared: "Universal education is not only the best and surest, but the only sure foundation for free institutions. True liberty is the child of knowledge. She pines and dies in the arms of ignorance."

The address made a splendid impression upon the large gathering of farmers, and Senator Frelinghuysen was complimented for his excellent review of the work of the education board.
