# NOT MUCH WORK FOR JANUARY COURT TERM ONE HOMICIDE TRIAL

ONLY SEVENTY-FIVE ISSUES ARE LISTED ON CIVIL CALENDAR .

Chauffeurs Who Run Down and Killed Woman and Child Under Investigation By Grand Jury--**Criminal Matters Consist Chiefly** of Minor Offenses.

On Tuesday next the January Term of the Atlantic County Courts will open, with Justice Samuel Kallsch, of the Supreme Court, presiding, Judge Howard Carrow on the Circuit Court bench and Judge C. L. Cole in the lower

The most important case that will come up for trial before Justice Kallsch is a homicide case, that of John Williams, charged with the murder of Martin Crusen, which occurred in Atlantic City in September last.

The civil list of cases as recorded on County Clerk Edwin A. Parker's docket, comprises twenty-six Supreme Court Issues: forty-two in the Circuit Court; four Common Pleas Court cases, and three Appeal cases.

The term promises to be one of the shortest, is far as the Criminal Court is concerned, in a number of years, insofar as nearly all of the enses are of a minor nature. It is thought that two manslaughter cases will probably be brought to the attention of the Grand Jury and several embezzlement, cases, while the remainder consist mainly of assault and battery and petty largeny. Two auto fatalities will be Investigated by the Grand Jury.
