

BUSINESS METHODS IN STATE AFFAIRS EDGE'S PROMISE TO PEOPLE

SENATOR FROM ATLANTIC FORMALLY ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY

STANDS ON LEGISLATIVE RECORD

Father of Efficiency and Economy, Consolidation of Departments and Proposed Budget System Claims Title To Republican Gubernatorial Nomination.

The candidacy of Senator Walter E. Edge, of Atlantic City, for the Republican gubernatorial nomination next September, has been formally announced by the Senator, who hereby outlines his policies and goes before the Republican voters on his seven years' record in the Legislature. Senator Edge yesterday issued the following statement:

"I had hoped that my definite statement as to my position in the coming political campaign might have been deferred, at least until the busy work of the legislative session was over. This is my first obligation, and I propose to give my undivided attention to it. At the same time, if my aspirants, or their supporters, feel that such haste is necessary, which view I understand has resulted in the circulation of pamphlets, naturally meaning little or less solicitation, then I feel in justice to my friends, who unselfishly interposed themselves in my behalf, that my position should likewise without delay be clearly defined.

"I shall be a candidate at the Primaries for the Republican gubernatorial nomination. "I have reached this conclusion only after a careful survey of existing conditions through interviews and correspondence with many interested citizens representing every county in the State. I have personally conducted this investigation on the firm conviction that a man is not justified in being a candidate for this high office unless he is able to find a reasonable sentiment favorable to his candidacy. Notwithstanding much public discussion and press references as to my position in the matter, I therefore, purposely refrained from making any final declaration until I had personally satisfied myself as to the general feeling existing in all parts of the State, and I really preferred to await the adjournment of the Legislature before actively entering the contest.

"I shall, however, in good time, start every proper effort to acquaint the public with the business policy that I will strictly adhere to, if honored with this high and powerful position, and feel confident my program will receive their endorsement and approval. "I deem it not improper to point to my seven years record in the Legislature, as indicating my interest in aggressive, constructive legislation, but shall not now attempt to go into detail, as to the successful fight I conducted for Workmen's Compensation, for Economy and Efficiency, for consolidation in State government, and many other matters leading up to the partial application of accepted business principles to State management.

"The work is far from completed and I only say briefly at this time that I desire to be Governor, not alone to gratify a personal ambition, but primarily to carry to a conclusion, as far as is possible, the Economy and Efficiency program in all its ramifications, likewise to make workable a complete budget system, through which a revised and modernized financial control can be developed, until the State of New Jersey's \$15,000,000 annual business will be conducted from a business man's standpoint, with the Governor the responsible business manager of the State, rather than the mere political leader of his party. I thoroughly appreciate the necessity for proper organization and leadership in politics, as in business, but that organization must be for service, rather than partisanship.

"It is my earnest belief that no man should be an aspirant for Governor without a clear and definite program, nor without being prepared to take the public into his confidence in this and other respects. "My activity in the Legislature has been directed with the hope that I could see New Jersey a real business proposition, with the main responsibility of the Governor being that of conducting the affairs of the State with all the opportunities for good, rather than the mere filling of a few offices, seemingly his most important accepted function.

"I shall make every effort to meet the people of the State during the months intervening before the Primaries, and to frankly detail to them what I hope to accomplish in their interest through a business administration of State affairs.

Damaged For 'Calling Names'

Mrs. Mary Shaw was awarded \$170 Tuesday in her suit for slander against Ella A. Bender. It developed that Mrs. Shaw had leased a property from Mrs. Bender. According to the complaint he was a passenger in Donnelly's jitney, and was thrown against the side of the machine when it struck a utility pole, while Donnelly was trying to avoid being struck by another car.

JUDGE SHINN PROVOKED OVER DELAY IN TRIALS

Jurymen Summoned At \$2.50 a Day, Find Law Mill Idle.

Through the postponement of cases listed for trial in the Circuit Court Wednesday, and Thursday, with many jurors and witnesses in attendance, the County treasury was negligently depleted of several hundred dollars. Jurymen are now paid at the rate of \$2.50 a day and mileage, which "sets the county back" quite a tidy sum every session they are called. Sheriff Joseph E. Bartlett estimated the jury expense Wednesday at \$190, and in addition to this there were constant and witness fees to be paid. The County Judge, Judge Shinn, was provoked at the delays and will endeavor in the future to "speed up" the work in this Court. He was here Wednesday morning at 9:30 ready to sit and there were no cases to be tried, the greater part of the morning. Shortly after eleven the jurymen were discharged until 1:30, when they reported and were again dismissed. On Thursday morning they were dismissed, with the exception of one juror, for the day, before noon. At the County Jail the jurymen were held until Tuesday morning next. Among the cases tried during the week were the following: Edward White, a collector, pleaded guilty to fleeing \$55 of his collections. He was placed on probation, to pay \$2.00 a week to his former employer for restitution of the amount and \$1 cent a week for three years to the probation officer.

Herbert Writbridge, pleading guilty to desertion, was sentenced to probation on condition that he support his wife.

Found guilty of assault on Marshall Kneemeyer, Martin Gandy was placed on probation for three years, to pay fifty cents a week for that period to the probation officer.

Thomas Allen, a fisherman, was acquitted of larceny of oysters and liquor from the Inlet Pavilion.

Clemency was extended to Mrs. Elvira Marchese, charged with larceny. She pleaded guilty to the larceny of a watch and jewelry from a store, and was released on probation.

Herbert Krieger, John Grand, Nicoll Clavel and Dominick Clavel, pleading "non vult" to using false registration tags on their auto, were placed on probation and fined 25 cents a week for three years.

Joseph Margerita, of Somers Point, appeared to plead not guilty to an indictment charging him with threatening the life of Mayor Charles Sheelman. He was fined \$500 as a condition of his release.

An indictment against Oscar Horn, of Northfield, for larceny, was nolle prosequendo to the death of the defendant.

Julius Foster entered a plea of guilty to atrocious assault. He was placed on probation and fined 50 cents a week for three years.

Twenty-eight indictments, some of them several years old, were nolle prosequendo by Judge Shinn, the Prosecutor stating that in most of the cases the facts had insufficient evidence to go to trial. There are as follows:

Philip Riley, Pleasantville, guilty of breaking, entering and larceny, fine twenty-five cents a week for three years.

Harry Boyer, Atlantic City, larceny, fine of twenty-five cents a week for three years.

Stephen Orme, Atlantic City, larceny, fine of twenty-five cents a week for three years.

William Alkasin, Atlantic City, larceny, fine one dollar a week for three years.

Harry Hiles, Atlantic City, larceny, fine twenty-five cents a week for three years.

Albert Wilson, William Barratt and James Henry, three boys who ran off with an automobile and made a trip to Philadelphia, were ordered by the court to pay a fine of twenty-five cents a week and report weekly to the probation officer.

FARM DEMONSTRATION DEPARTMENT NEWS

Solving Market Problems An Important Question To Farmers Of Atlantic County—Some Practical Suggestions.

Solving the market question is a problem in which Atlantic County farmers should be deeply interested, and going to the market at a fair profit is one of the greatest factors in successful soil tilling. Some good suggestions were made at a Market Conference recently held in New Brunswick. Mr. J. J. Dillon, Commissioner of Markets of New York, discussed New York's effort to improve marketing conditions. The main line taken up the past season was the selling of fruit by auction. The reason he started on the fruit was that he had the largest quantity of fruit to sell. The commission men would pay them any price they saw fit. His object was to have the growers ship at least five carloads a day to the market in New York and then allow him to sell them at auction, causing the different commission men who wished to purchase not only to pay the top price per barrel, but also to set an average price for the apples sold, with the commission men acting as well as the auctioneer. The results were good but growers did not ship enough and buyers found the supply exhausted too soon. The same plan was tried with peaches, proving very satisfactory. Mr. Dillon declared that peaches were never in better condition for selling and bringing good prices than the day they landed in the market; while commission men held them over to the following day hoping for better prices, with the result that the fruit deteriorated.

Mr. Dillon said there are very few real commission men in New York, and he suggested the farmer what they please, instead of selling on commission. In many cases, if goods are shipped to a commission man, he sells them to another commission man, or possibly a retail man. The commission man or retail man pays carriage; but the commission man to whom the grower shipped his fruit, always adds carriage to the bill. All goods sold either by the auction or through a commission man, the grower will get a better price. Oftentimes the farmer condemns the man who sells his goods when he himself is to blame. "Therefore," he said, "let us teach the farmers to have a standard to grade by and also pack in attractive packages."

Prof. M. A. Blake, State Horticulturist, gave an address on "A Venture of Co-operative Marketing" which was tried out the past summer at East Vineland. Early in the Spring of 1915, thirteen peach growers, raising that year a co-riperan crop of peaches, formed a cooperative association to dispose of their fruit. They organized the East Vineland Peach Growers' Association, taking good care of their orchards through the summer, properly spraying and thinning the fruit. When the fruit started to ripen a manager was appointed whose duty it was to find the best markets. The manager was able to find fifteen good markets, including Maine, Massachusetts, Vermont, New York, Connecticut, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, North Carolina, South
